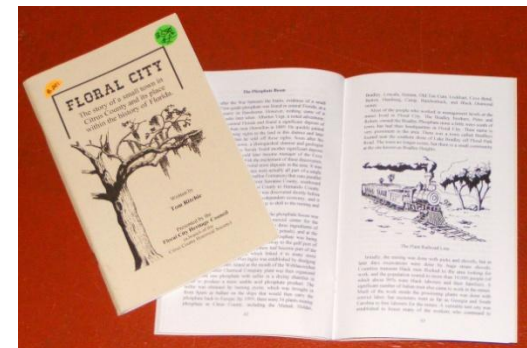


The popular vanity car tags have been reduced: Two for One or 2/\$3.00 w/tax.

From the old pecan grove that once stood where the community parking lot is now, comes handmade pens, pencils, letter-openers, magnifying glasses and more. These make exceptionally special gifts or keepsakes.

A number of food related items are in the Museum "Country" Store; these range from local honey of Orange Blossom, Wildflower and Tupelo with wooden honey dippers to the familiar Watkins brand of seasonings.
